This filing makes revisions to incorporate the requirements of the Federal Communications Commission Report and Order in WC Docket No. 10-90, etc., FCC No. 11-161 (released Nov 18, 2011) ("FCC Order") which requires the Company to reduce its terminating switched access rates. This filing also makes text changes to the VoIP-PSTN language to reflect changes to originating Toll VoIP-PSTN access charge language pursuant to the Second Order on Reconsideration in the same Docket (FCC No. 12-47 Releases April 26, 2012). 



(3) FY2011 Demand

Demand data is not readily available. Based on the current rate structure, the resulting calculations for the rate reductions are identical at any demand level. There are no dedicated service off-sets to per minute rates, so the company has applied a reduction of 50% of the differential to those rates which are higher than the corresponding interstate rate.

(4) GCLS's intrastate and interstate rate structures are identical.

(5) The methodology is described in #3 above.

(6) GCLS has elected to reduce intrastate rates rather than converting to interstate rates with an additive. (Option1)

A Calculation and Application of Percent-VoIP- Usage Factors (cont'd)

2. The Customer will calculate and furnish to the Company a terminating PVU factor representing the whole number percentage of the Customer's total terminating intrastate access MOU that the Customer exchanges with the Company in the LATA that is sent to Company and which originated in IP format and that would be billed by the Company as intrastate access MOU. Beginning July 1, 2014, the Customer will also calculate and furnish to the Company an originating PVU factor representing the whole number percentage of the Customer's total originating intrastate access MOU that the Customer exchanges with the Company in the LATA that is received from the Company and that is terminated in IP format and that would be billed by the Company as intrastate access MOU. (N)
3. The Customer shall not modify their reported PIU factor to account for VoIP-PSTN Traffic. (T)
4. Both the Customer provided originating PVU and the terminating PVU shall be based on information such as the number of the Customer's retail VoIP subscriptions in the state (e.g. as reported on F.C.C. Form 477), traffic studies, actual call detail or other relevant and verifiable information which will be provided to the Company upon request. (T)
5. The Customer shall retain the call detail, work papers, and information used to develop the PVU factors for a minimum of one year. (T)

6. The Company shall use default factors until such time as the Customer supplies such factors. For this purpose, the Company will utilize a PVU equal to the percentage of VoIP subscribers in the state based on the Local Competition Report, as released periodically and/or such other reports as the Company deems appropriate and reasonable. Under the Local Competition report methodology, the PVU will be the total number of incumbent LEC and non-incumbent LEC VoIP subscriptions in a state divided by the sum of those reported VoIP subscriptions plus incumbent LEC and non-incumbent LEC switched access lines. (T)

B The preceding section 3.1.2 will be applied to the billing of switched access charges to a Customer that is a local exchange carrier only to the extent that the Customer has also implemented billing of interstate access charges for VoIP-PSTN Traffic in accordance with FCC orders, rules and regulations.

C Initial Implementation of PVU Factors

1. If the PVU factors cannot be implemented in the Company's billing systems by December 29, 2011, once the factors can be implemented the Company will adjust the Customer's bills to reflect the PVU factors prospectively in the next bill period if the PVU factors are provided by the Customer to the Company prior to April 15, 2012.
2. The Company may choose to provide credits based on the reported PVU factors on a quarterly basis until such time as the billing system modifications can be implemented.
