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TARIFF FORMAT

Page Numbering - Page numbers appear in the upper right hand corner of the page. Pages are numbered sequentially. From time to time new pages may be added to the tariff. 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APPLICATION OF TARIFF

This tariff contains the regulations and rates applicable to the furnishing of intrastate telecommunications service and operator services by Operator Service Company, LLC ("OSC") within the State of South Carolina.

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SECTION 1.0 - EXPLANATION OF TERMS AND ABBREVIATIONS**Calling Card**

A billing arrangement by which a call may be charged to a valid telephone-company issued card number.

Carrier

Whenever used in this tariff, "Carrier" refers to Operator Service Company, unless otherwise specified or clearly indicated by the context.

Collect Call

A billing arrangement by which the charge for a call may be charged to the called party, provided the called party accepts the charge with a positive response.

Commercial Credit Card Call

A billing arrangement by which a call may be charged to an authorized major commercial credit card, such as MasterCard, VISA, or Diners Club.

Company

Whenever used in this tariff, "Company" refers to Operator Service Company, LLC., unless otherwise specified or clearly indicated by the context.

Company Recognized Holidays

New Year's Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, and Christmas Day, as nationally observed.

Customer Dialed Calling Card Call

A service whereby the end user dials all of the digits necessary to route and bill the call without any operator assistance.

End User

Any person, firm, partnership, corporation, or other entity using the Company's services, the rates for which are described in this tariff. The End User is typically a member of the transient public and, as such, does not contract directly with OSC for provisioning or termination of service.

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SECTION 1.0 - EXPLANATION OF TERMS AND ABBREVIATIONS *continued*

Operator Station Call

A service whereby the caller places a non-person-to-person call with the assistance of an operator (live or automated).

OSC

Used throughout this tariff to refer to Operator Service Company, LLC.

Pay Telephone

A telephone instrument equipped with a credit card reader, coin box, or similar device that allows a charge to be made for each call.

Person-to-Person Call

A service whereby the person originating the call specifies to the Company operator a particular person to be reached, or a particular person, station, room number, department, or office to be reached through a PBX attendant.

Serving Wire Center

A specified geographic point from which the vertical and horizontal coordinate is used in calculation of airline mileage.

Subscriber

The person, firm, partnership, corporation, or other entity who orders telecommunications service from OSC. Service may be ordered by, or on behalf of, those who own, lease or otherwise manage the pay telephone, PBX, or other switch vehicle from which an End User places a call utilizing the services of the Company.

Third Party Billed Call

A billing arrangement by which the charges for a call may be billed to a number that is different from the calling number or the called number.

SECTION 2.0 - RULES AND REGULATIONS**2.1 Undertaking of Operator Service Company, LLC**

Operator Service Company, LLC's primary customers are those companies who in their normal course of business are responsible for providing access and directing telephone calls for large numbers of End Users. OSC Subscribers are generally hotels, motels, hospitals, universities, and other similar properties where callers pay for calls on an individual basis.

Operator Service Company Long Distance Service is provided through the terminal equipment of Subscribers serving the transient public.

2.2 Limitations

2.2.1 Service is offered subject to the availability of the necessary facilities or equipment and subject to the provisions of this tariff.

2.2.2 The Company reserves the right to discontinue service when necessitated by conditions beyond its control, or when the Customer or Subscriber is using the service in violation of the provisions of this tariff, or in violation of the law.

2.2.3 The Company does not undertake to transmit messages, but offers the use of its facilities when available, and will not be liable for errors in transmission or for failure to establish connections.

2.2.4 All facilities provided under this tariff are directly or indirectly controlled by OSC and the Subscriber may not transfer or assign the use of service or facilities without the express written consent of the Company. Such transfer or assignment shall only apply where there is not interruption of the use or location of the service or facilities.

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SECTION 2.0 - RULES AND REGULATIONS *continued*

2.2 Limitations *continued*

2.2.5 Prior written permission from the Company is required before any assignment or transfer. All regulations and conditions contained in this tariff shall apply to all such permitted assignees or transferees, as well as all conditions of service.

2.3 Use

Services provided under this tariff may be used for any lawful purpose for which the service is technically suited. Services provided under this tariff shall not be used for unlawful purposes.

2.4 Liability

2.4.1 The Company shall not be liable for claim or loss, expense or damage (including indirect, special or consequential damage), for any interruption, delay, error, omission, or defect in any service, facility or transmission provided under this tariff, if caused by any person or entity other than the Company, by any malfunction of any service or facility provided by any other carrier, by an act of God, fire, war, civil disturbance, or act of government, or by any other cause beyond the Company's direct control.

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SECTION 2.0 - RULES AND REGULATIONS *continued*

2.4 Liability *continued*

- 2.4.2 The Company shall not be liable for, and shall be fully indemnified and held harmless by Customer and Subscriber against any claim or loss, expense, or damage (including indirect, special or consequential damage) for defamation, libel, slander, invasion, infringement of copyright or patent, unauthorized use of any trademark, tradename or service mark, unfair competition, interference with or misappropriation or violation of any contract, proprietary or creative right, or any other injury to any person, property or entity arising out of the material, data, information, or other content revealed to, transmitted, or used by the Company under this tariff; or for any act or omission of the Customer or Subscriber; or for any personal injury or death of any person caused directly or indirectly by the installation, maintenance, location, condition, operation, failure, presence, use, or removal of equipment or wiring provided by the Company, if not directly caused by negligence of the Company.
- 2.4.3 The Company shall not be liable for any defacement of or damages to the premises of a Subscriber resulting from the furnishing of service which is not the direct result of the Company's negligence.
- 2.4.4 OSC's responsibility for damages arising out of transmission errors shall not exceed an amount equivalent to the proportionate charge to the Customer for the period during which the transmission errors occur.

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SECTION 2.0 - RULES AND REGULATIONS *continued*

2.5 Terminal Equipment

Carrier's facilities and service may be used with or terminated in Subscriber-provided terminal equipment or Subscriber-provided communications systems, such as a PBX. Such PBX terminal equipment shall be furnished and maintained at the expense of the Subscriber, except as otherwise provided. The Subscriber is responsible for all costs at his/her premises, including personnel, wiring, electrical power, and the like, incurred in his use of Carrier's service. When such terminal equipment is used, the equipment shall comply with the generally accepted minimum protective criteria standards of the telecommunications industry.

2.6 Installation and Termination

Service is installed upon contractual agreement between the Subscriber and the Company. The contractual agreement specifies the terms and conditions of installation, termination of service, commission structure, and commission payment schedule.

2.7 Payment for Service and Credit Allowance

2.7.1 Payment for Service

All charges due are payable to any agency duly authorized to receive such payments. Any objection to billed charges should be promptly reported to the Billing Agency. Adjustments to Customer's bills shall be made to the extent circumstances exist which reasonably indicate that such changes are appropriate.

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SECTION 2.0 - RULES AND REGULATIONS *continued*

2.7 Payment for Service and Credit Allowance *continued*

2.7.2 Taxes and Fees

For all calls, state and local taxes (i.e., gross receipts tax, sales tax, municipal utilities tax) are listed as separate line items on the Customer's bill and are not included in the quoted rates and charges set forth in this tariff.

To the extent that a municipality, other political subdivision or local agency of government, or Commission imposes upon and collects from the Company a gross receipts tax, occupation tax, license tax, permit fee, franchise fee, or regulatory fee, such taxes and fees shall, insofar as practicable and allowed by law, be billed pro rata to Customers receiving service from the Company within the territorial limits of such municipality, other political subdivision or local agency of government.

The Company may adjust its rates and charges or impose additional rates and charges on its Customers in order to recover amounts it is required by governmental or quasi-governmental authorities to collect from or pay to others in support of statutory or regulatory programs. Such adjustments shall be listed in this tariff.

A. Universal Service Fund

An additional surcharge of 2.13% will be added to charges for recovery of Universal Service Fund obligations.

SECTION 2.0 - RULES AND REGULATIONS *continued***2.7** Payment for Service and Credit Allowance *continued***2.7.2** Taxes and Fees *continued***B.** Pay Telephone Surcharge

In order to recover the Company's expenses to comply with the FCC's pay telephone compensation plan effective on October 7, 1997 (FCC 97-371), an undiscountable per call charge is applicable to all interstate, intrastate and international calls that originate from any domestic pay telephone used to access the Company's services. The Pay Telephone Surcharge, which is in addition to standard tariffed usage charges and any applicable service charges and surcharges associated with the Company's service, applies for the use of the instrument used to access the Company service and is unrelated to the Company's service accessed from the pay telephone.

Pay telephones include coin-operated and coinless phones owned by local telephone companies, independent companies and other interexchange carriers. The Pay Telephone Surcharge applies to the initial completed call and any reoriginated call (i.e., using the "#" symbol).

Whenever possible, the Pay Telephone Surcharge will appear on the same invoice containing the usage charges for the surcharged call. In cases where proper pay telephone coding digits are not transmitted to the Company prior to completion of a call, the Pay Telephone Surcharge may be billed on a subsequent invoice after the Company has obtained information from a carrier that the originating station is an eligible pay telephone.

The Pay Telephone Surcharge does not apply to calls placed from pay telephones at which the Customer pays for service by inserting coins during the progress of the call.

2.8 Minimum Service Period

Unless otherwise provided by written agreement, the minimum period for service is one month (30 days).

2.9 Other Rules

2.9.1 The Company reserves the right to refuse to process Credit Card or Calling Card billed calls when authorization for use of the card cannot be validated.

2.9.2 The Company reserves the right to refuse Third Party billing at its discretion. The Company reserves the right to discontinue service, limit service, or to impose requirements on Subscribers as required to meet changing regulatory rules and standards of the South Carolina Public Service Commission.

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SECTION 3.0 - DESCRIPTION OF SERVICE OFFERED**3.1 General**

OSC's Long Distance Service is offered for calling within the State of South Carolina. Calls are routed to any valid NPA-NXX in the State of South Carolina.

OSC's Operator Assisted Long Distance Service is provided for use by transient End Users at host locations. This service anticipates the provision of operator services or billing options. Calls are measured as described in Sections 3.2 and 3.3 of this tariff and rated based on time of day, call duration and mileage. Per-minute usage sensitive charges, as well as per-call operator surcharges apply.

3.2 Rounding and Timing of Calls

3.2.1 Long distance charges are based on the duration of each call.

3.2.2 The standard minimum call duration period for billing purposes is one (1) minute.

3.2.3 Unless otherwise specified in this tariff, usage after the initial period is measured and rounded to the next higher full minute for billing purposes.

3.2.4 The Company will not bill for unanswered calls. When an End User indicates that he/she was billed for an incomplete call, OSC will reasonably issue credit for the call.

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SECTION 3.0 - DESCRIPTION OF SERVICE OFFERED *continued***3.3 Determination of Mileage**

Usage charges for all mileage sensitive products are based on the airline distance between serving wire centers associated with the originating and terminating points of the call. The serving wire centers of a call are determined by the area codes and exchanges of the origination and destination points.

The distance between the Wire Center of the Customer's equipment and that of the destination point is calculated by using the "V" and "H" coordinates.

Step 1 - Obtain the "V" and "H" coordinates for the Wire Centers serving the Customer and the destination point.

Step 2 - Obtain the difference between the "V" coordinates of each of the Wire Centers. Obtain the Difference between the "H" coordinates.

Step 3 - Square the differences obtained in Step 2.

Step 4 - Add the squares of the "V" difference and "H" difference obtained in Step 3.

Step 5 - Divide the sum of the square obtained in Step 4 by ten (10). Round to the next higher whole number if any fraction results from the division.

Step 6 - Obtain the square root of the whole number obtained in Step 5. Round to the next higher whole number if any fraction is obtained. This is the distance between the Wire Centers.

Formula:

SECTION 3.0 - DESCRIPTION OF SERVICE OFFERED *continued*

3.4 Application of Service Charges

In addition to usage sensitive rates, one of the following per-call service charge applies to all operator assisted calls. In those instances in which the Customer places a jurisdictionally local call using this service by dialing the long distance access method described above, the call will be carried by the Company and charged at the rates listed in Section 5.4 and according to the terms and conditions of this tariff.

3.4.1 Customer Dialed Calling/Credit Card Charge

This charge applies in addition to the normal long distance usage charges for calls placed utilizing an authorized credit card or telephone calling card. The Customer must dial all of the digits required to route and bill the call.

3.4.2 Operator Station Charge

This charge applies to calls placed on a station-to-station basis with operator assistance, regardless of billing method. Calls may be billed to the called party (collect), to a calling/credit card or to a third party telephone number.

3.4.3 Person to Person

This charge applies to calls placed to a particular party at the destination number. Charges do not apply unless the specified party or an acceptable substitute is available. Calls may be billed to a third number, credit/calling card, or the called party.

SECTION 3.0 - DESCRIPTION OF SERVICE OFFERED *continued*

3.4 Application of Service Charges *continued*

3.4.4 Busy Line Verification / Busy Line Interrupt

Busy Line Verification and Interrupt Service, furnished where facilities permit, provides the Customer with the following options:

A. Busy Line Verification

Upon request of the calling party, the Operator will determine if the line being called is clear or in use and will only report that status back to the calling party.

B. Busy Line Verification with Interrupt

The operator will determine if the line being called is clear or in use and if in use, will interrupt the call on the called line if the calling party indicates an emergency exists and therefore requests the interruption

SECTION 3.0 - DESCRIPTION OF SERVICE OFFERED *continued*

3.5 Operator Dialed Surcharge

A surcharge applies to calls when the customer has the capability of dialing all the digits necessary to complete a call, but elects to dial only the appropriate operator code and requests the operator to dial the called station's telephone number.

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SECTION 3.0 - DESCRIPTION OF SERVICE OFFERED *continued*

3.5 Nonsubscriber Service Charge

The following charge is in addition to the basic rate tables when a dial station, operator station, or a person-to-person call originates from a residential line which is not presubscribed to OSC as the primary interexchange carrier. The Non-Subscriber Service Charge does not apply to: Calling card calls, intraLATA calls, conference calls, calls to OSC directory assistance, toll free or 900 telephone numbers, Telecommunications Relay Service, calls originated from cellular phones, Customers with disabilities who are certified, calls originated on residential lines which have discontinued presubscription to OSC but for whom an active billing record still exists in OSC's billing system. This charge is effective in all local exchange areas where billing is available.

3.6 Directory Assistance

A Customer may obtain assistance, for a charge, in determining a telephone number by dialing Directory Assistance Service.

A Directory Assistance Charge applies for each telephone number, area code, and/or general information requested from the Directory Assistance operator. No call allowance applies.

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SECTION 3.0 - DESCRIPTION OF SERVICE OFFERED *continued*

3.7 OSC Directory Assistance Call Completion

The Company Directory Assistance operator will complete the call to the number requested by the Customer without requiring the Customer to redial the number. A per minute Directory Assistance Call Completion rate applies for the duration of each completed call. This per minute usage rate is in addition to the charge for determining the telephone number requested by the Customer.

OSC Directory Assistance Call Completion is available for use with Station to Station calls. Directory Assistance Call Completion may not be used in conjunction with operator assisted calling. For billing purposes, calls are billed in six (6) second increments after an initial billing increment of one (1) minute.

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SECTION 4.0 - RATES

4.1 General Application of Rates

No charge applies to emergency calls to recognized emergency numbers.
